I know Ed wants to do a more detailed article on our Lent Fish Dinners, so I told him I would provide this brief update for our April newsletter.

The 2024 dinners continued our unbroken string of consecutive positive cash flows which totaled almost \$9,900. Cumulatively the dinners have generated almost \$76,000 over their 14 consecutive years. More importantly the dinners bring together a crew of both Knight and Ladies Ministry Fellowship volunteers to serve dinners to hundreds of parishioners each year.

I was born (in 1982) and raised in Bakersfield. A cradle Catholic, I am a 4th generation Catholic that began with my great grandmother who was the daughter of an American Indian (Cherokee) mother raised on a reservation. I was principally raised in the faith at Our Lady of Perpetual Help parish with Rev. Michael Braun. A few years after graduating high school, I was accepted into the California Highway Patrol Academy in 2004 at 21 years old, following my father's and uncle's example. Later, both of my younger brothers would follow, leading to a new

family tradition. Both brothers currently work for the CHP as sergeants in the Bakersfield and Ft. Tejon offices.

After graduating from the academy, I spent my entire 10-year CHP career in Castro Valley located in the east bay area of San Francisco. Ultimately, I resigned to return to college and pursue a new career in medicine. I returned to Bakersfield and began my studies at Bakersfield College, ultimately chosen as the biology student of the year in 2016 by the faculty. After graduating with an associate degree, I was accepted to UCs San Diego, Santa Barbara, and Irvine, but I decided to stay in Bakersfield to attend CSUB to stay close to family. I graduated from CSUB (cum laude) in 2023 and was chosen as the human biology undergraduate student of the year and was enrolled in the university's honor society. After taking the MCAT, I was accepted into three medical schools and chose to attend Burrell College of Osteopathic Medicine in Las Cruces, NM, for the class of 2027. After graduation, I plan to complete my residency in emergency medicine at Kern Medical Hospital in Bakersfield and continue as an attending physician.

I joined the Knights of Columbus after much contemplation. Torn between focusing on my college studies and finding new opportunities to serve and volunteer within the community, I turned to my late grandmother's advice: in this current world, we need to surround ourselves with those people who will strengthen our faith. I can attest that the council has certainly done this for me.

Having no interest in dating outside the Catholic faith, I met my wife Yvonne through a catholic dating website (catholicmatch.com) in May 2015. As we were both very weary and careful of online dating, so we did not formally meet in person until December 2015, the feast day of Our Lady of Guadalupe. We were married in January 2018 at St. Hilary's catholic church (Pico Rivera) in the archdiocese of Los Angeles.

One of my hobbies include open water scuba diving. I have been diving for nearly 25 years and am registered as an advanced scuba diver and as a wreck diver. I have dived at Catalina, Channel Islands, Hawaii, and Cayman Islands to name a few. Yvonne and I also like to travel to national historic sites throughout the country. Some of the more unique sites we have visited include Ford's Theater in DC and Manzanar Japanese internment camp outside of Lone Pine. There are currently over 400 sites within the national park service, including national parks, and we hope to visit them all eventually.
