MESSAGE FROM MONSIGNOR

Dear Brother Knights and Friends:

Many people of good faith celebrate the Resurrection of Christ on Easter Sunday. Typically, it is the day when the greatest number of people attend Mass or a Christian worship service. While the numbers we must accommodate on that day seem overwhelming, we should be thankful that people who may *not* attend Mass faithfully still find it important to be here at Easter. The challenge for those of us who attend Mass regularly is to be hospitable and welcoming to those who are with us only once or twice each year. Who knows? Maybe the way we interact with and welcome visitors will help plant some seed within them that may blossom into a sincere faith some day!

One way of looking at this "situation" is to remember how the apostles themselves (with the exception of John) failed to remain with Jesus after he was arrested and when he was crucified. On the one day they should have been with Jesus, they were nowhere to be seen—hiding out of fear of the authorities. Yet, when Jesus rose from the dead, he appeared to all of them and forgave them. We should not be too surprised if the Lord blesses our "absent" Catholics in the same way he blesses those of us who are more "regular" in our attendance at Mass. Don't get me wrong: Mass attendance is important and the blessings we receive in the Eucharist are indispensable to our spiritual lives. Yet, we should be careful not to judge those who do not attend Mass. The Lord has his ways of working in the hearts of all who may not be very strong in their faith commitment. He can draw them closer at any moment in life. Our prayers for them can assist them in this way.

So, as we celebrate the Resurrection of Jesus at Easter, let us pray for the spiritual well-being of all of our family members and friends whose faith may need some strengthening. When we gather with them at Easter, let us demonstrate the love of Christ toward them by our words and actions.

Grand Knight April 2025 Message

We just ended the 3rd Quarter of our fraternal year at the end of March. It's been a busy and fruitful time. Just to review all that we've done, it's amazing to see how much we have helped our parish and community.

In mid-January, the SEAS Knights assisted with taking down all of the beautiful Christmas decorations in the Chapel and hallway. At the end of January on the weekend of 24-26, we had the annual SEAS Men's Retreat at St. Anthony's Retreat Center in Three Rivers. Fr Jim Nisbet's theme was "Christian Living in the 21st Century". I ask for all of you to mark your calendar for the 2026 Men's Retreat which is again slated for the last full weekend in January of 2026 (January 24-26). In Mid-February the Knights prepared and served breakfast to the homeless at St. Vincent DePaul which is always such a rewarding experience to just see the joy and happiness a simple gesture of a good meal brings. Our Council was also able to donate \$500 to St. Vincent DePaul. March started out with the AM Roadside Cleanup and then on the same day assisted our parish with the SEAS Mardi Gras celebration on the patio. In addition, on Saturday March 15 the Knights showed up early at 7AM to help the Brett Striegel family by removing 14 oleander bushes, cleaning up the yard, converting an interior window and replacing it with a door, some plumbing fixes, and installing a basketball hoop in the driveway. The family was so appreciative with all the help we were able to give. The Knights also prepared and served four March Friday Lenten Fish Dinners with the invaluable help of LMF. We also had our monthly business meetings and great meals and companionship at the social dinner meetings.

This quarter was filled with the time, talent, and treasure along with the many prayers of our SEAS Brother Knights for our families, friends, non-profits and SEAS under the leadership of our Chaplain Msgr. Perry

Dues

As we move into the second-half of our fraternal year, we are still in the process of collecting dues for the 2024-2025 year. Thus far we have collected dues from 136 of the 172 Council members who pay dues. We are still trying to collect dues from a few dozen Council members. If you have not paid dues yet, please remember that dues can be paid online through our Council website or by emailing a check to our financial secretary Chris Zeimer.

Thus far our dues collection has brought in \$6,376. We have collected an additional \$4,187 in optional dues. This brings us to a grand total of \$10,563 collected. We anticipate collecting another \$1,710 from those members who have not yet paid.

Membership

In the month of March, we added three members to the council. We welcome new members Bryce Zaben and Clayton Cobbs as well as a reentry of brother Dario Fonseca. This brings our overall membership to 199 members, 147 of those are associate members and 52 are insurance members. Supreme Council set our yearly quota at 11 members.
