Dear Brother Knights and Friends:

As you probably already know, Jim Dutton, our long-time custodian, died last month at the age of 88. Jim was already retired and serving as a crossing guard for Veteran's Elementary School when I invited him to consider working for our still-new parish. We were meeting at Frontier High School in those early years and were renting a small store front "Ministry Center" on Allen Rd. Jim jumped at the opportunity and, for the next 15 years, served as our custodian and all-around handyman. He was very generous with his time and there was no job that he wasn't willing to do. When the time came for our parish to establish a Knights of Columbus Council, Jim volunteered to serve as its first Grand Knight. When we were ready to occupy our new building in 2015, Jim was a life-saver—assisting in the move and helping us establish ourselves as a full-fledged parish.

In recent years, Jim's health began to deteriorate but he remained on board to assist us as he was able. Jim's presence was a blessing to all of us. His funny stories kept me and the staff laughing. Even when I visited him a few days before his passing, he was cheerful and talkative.

Now Jim has been reunited with his wife, Barbara; son, David; and granddaughter, Ashley. Please remember to offer a prayer for the peaceful repose of his soul. May he rest in God's peace.

#### Other Goals we have set for Council 14754 are as follows:

- 1. Recruit at least 15 new members. (All of you can recruit!) We have membership recruitment after Masses on Oct 12 & 13<sup>th</sup> inviting guests to join us at our meeting on Monday, Oct 14th.

- 3. Our Council has been providing financial support to our seminarians and we are continuing to do so with Seminarian, Elliot Yaryk, who will be with us at SEAS until the end of December 2024.

- 5. We need at least <u>two additional Knights</u> to usher each week for the **11:30 AM Mass**. If we have 26 Knights volunteer for just one 11:30 AM Mass, we can cover 13 weeks. We would ask the Knights to arrive by 11:15 AM and report to the usher in charge, which is usually our Knight Financial Secretary, Chris Ziemer. This is flexible scheduling and perhaps you may be able to schedule more Sundays as a volunteer. PLEASE contact and sign up with DGK Louis Rodriguez. He will create a schedule that will meet your availability. A Flocknote will be sent out as part of this usher recruitment needed for the 11:30 AM Mass.
- 6. Assist all 1st and 2nd degree members to become 3rd degree members. (Membership Committee)
- 7. We will also be updating our Brother Knight's contact records (cell phone, email, and snail mail information, and get spouse or next of kin contact information on file.) If a Brother Knight, his wife and any dependent children are ill, become disabled or pass away we are available to assist the family. Our Membership Director, Craig Holliday along with assistance from PGK Jim Patten, yours truly, and other Knight volunteers will assist.
- 8. Provide and add more prayer resources to our Brother Knights and their families.
- 9. Earn the Father McGivney Award, the Columbian Award, and become a Star Council.

We are looking forward to a blessed year and I pray that all of us grow in our Charity, Fraternity, and Unity.
