## **Dues Payment Update** by Craig Holliday, Membership Director.

As of December 31, 2024 slightly more than half of our dues paying members (89 out of 173) have paid their 2025 dues. Remember that we have about a dozen members who pay no regular dues or limited dues for a variety of reasons. The dues collection has brought in \$4,158 in regular dues.

We have also collected a very impressive \$3,579 in optional dues from members. To date 65 members have contributed optional dues. The average optional contribution is about \$55 per member. These optional dues help offset a variety of expenses, including sponsoring our seminarians, providing food for St. Vincent de Paul breakfasts, helping first time Men's Retreat attendees, and a host of other charitable efforts.

The most popular method of dues payment this year is check (46% of payments). Followed by credit card (27%), through the website (16%) and cash (11%).

As a reminder, you may still pay your dues at the January meeting (January 13, 2025). Brothers who do not pay their dues by January 15, 2025, will be sent a second dues letter shortly thereafter.
