Get rich quick..... count your blessings.


Dear Brother Knights and friends:

Fall Membership Drive by Craig Holliday, Membership Director

The Fall Membership Drive was a tremendous success. Over the weekend before Columbus Day, Knights made podium announcements at all four Masses. Members also manned a table in the church lobby before and after all the Masses. We talked with about 15 men from the parish about joining the Knights. These men were invited to join us for dinner and fellowship on the night of our Columbus Day meeting, October the 14th. The membership Committee is in the process of following up with these men and a few of them have already cleared the application process, finished their exemplifications, and become members of the Council.

Online Membership vs. Council Membership by Craig Holliday, Membership Director

As it is the time of the year for our membership drive, I'd like to spend a moment clarifying the difference between Online membership and Council membership.

- Application process: Online members join using the supreme website. Men wanting to directly join our council would use our council's membership application which can be downloaded from our council website. Online members who enter our Council number (14754) when they join online will be invited into council membership.
- **Dues**: Our Council dues are \$48 per year and paid to our council. Online membership dues are free for the first 12 months and billed by supreme at \$30 per year thereafter. Supreme issues membership cards to online members and our Council supplies membership cards for Council members.
- Attending Knights meetings: Online members and Council members may attend any Knights meeting anywhere by presenting their Knight membership card. This is why the card is often referred to as your traveling card. Online membership is often better for members who live in areas that do not have councils or for members who are frequently on the road.
- Voting in meetings and serving in leadership positions. Online members are not permitted to vote on Council issues. Additionally, they may not serve in officer or committee chairman positions. Online members can become Council members by submitting our Council's membership application to me.

Update on the 2025 Dues Cycle by Craig Holliday, Membership Director

The 2025 dues payment cycle began at our October Council meeting. Knights who attended the meeting were presented their bill statement for the 2025 dues year. As of the October meeting, we received 24 dues payments; we have also had 17 Knights pay optional dues. There are 151 Knights in the council who still need to pay their 2025 dues. As a reminder, you may pay your dues at our November meeting by cash, check, or credit card. Knights may also pay their dues at any time online through our website. Dues statements not delivered by hand by the November meeting will be

mailed out soon afterwards. The deadline for dues payment is January 15, 2025. If you have dues questions or concerns, please contact Craig Holliday at craig-holliday@kernhigh.org or 661-599-9219.
